FIFTY? That's right; on June 14th, 2012, the 427 (London) Wing will turn fifty. With the end of the Second World War, airmen returning home to London wanted to continue their interest in aviation both as flyers and friends.

- April 2, 1947 the London Air Force Association was formed with a constitution and by-laws.
- March 15, 1950 427 (London) Wing received its charter from the RCAFA and, today, is one of the leading members of what has now become the Air Force Association of Canada (AFAC,) with more than seventy Wings across this country.
- June 14, 1962 Subsequently, 427 Wing was incorporated under the laws of Ontario and received its provincial charter and its liquor license in the fall of 1963.

One of the more interesting features about 427 Wing is the building that it occupies on the grounds of the London International Airport. Built in 1939-40 as an Airmen's Canteen, a place where wartime personnel could relax and be refreshed, it is believed to be the last still usable building of its kind in south-western Ontario. Post-war, it remained in use throughout the Korean and NATO eras until purchased by 427 Wing on September 1, 1959. Watch out for next year...and remember it's our 50th....keep the ideas coming. Do you think we could get the Prime Minister, the Premier or who do you know that would make this a spectacular event for the Wing? And if the Wing would not be able to handle the crowds, where would we go to make it happen?





Fairchild – (C)C-119 Flying Boxcar

The Boxcar put into service by the RCAF was actually an evolution of the Fairchild C-82 Packet designed in 1941. First flown in 1944, the C-82 was briefly manufactured by both Fairchild and North American Aviation, but the end of the war saw the latter's production cease, and by 1948 manufacture of the C-82 stopped entirely in favour of the improved C-119. Retaining the Packet's basic design features of twin-tail booms and a clamshell door, the C-119 was slimmer, had more powerful engines, and a relocated flight deck.

When the Boxcar was introduced to the RCAF in April 1952, it gave Air Transport Command (ATC) its first heavy lift transport capable of accommodating 65 troops. They were used in the Army support and Arctic resupply roles, but in the extreme cold of the Arctic winter, aircraft would not stay on the ground any longer than necessary, hence, most resupplies were by parachute drop. When overnight stops did occur, the engine oil was diluted with aviation fuel, the amount of dilution dependent on the forecast overnight temperature.

Keeping these figures in mind, in the next issue of the Link I will pass on the stats for the newest heavy lift aircraft procured by the RCAF, the Boeing C-17 Globemaster 111, so you can compare what equipment we had in the past and what we have now. Until the next issue, keep well, and drop in for a nice lunch some Friday.

Drinking Water – Gratefully reproduced from 702 Wing Lethbridge, Vapour Trails Newsletter.
